

ST GEORGE'S HUMANITARIAN ORGANIZATIONS

St. George Share and Care: To reach out, as part of the St. George lay ministry, through loving action, to those less able to care for themselves, the most vulnerable members of our community, with the aim of increasing their social network, quality of life and autonomy.

Aziz Tabah Foundation Scholarship: This scholarship targets Canadian citizens of Lebanese-Syrian origin who require financial assistance to pursue a full-time university education. Applicants must be full-time students attending or about to enter university or an equivalent post-secondary institution other than C.E.G.E.P.

Family Assistance Program: The Family Assistance Program provides for all in the Parish a place to discuss concerns about any aspect of life, in complete confidentiality.

The Saint George Foundation: A humanitarian group, affiliated to St. George Orthodox Church. The foundation is committed to promoting awareness and raising funds for specified diseases that are apparent within and outside of the church community.

The Benevolent Fund: An organization that reaches out to those in the parish who are in need, especially new immigrants.

The Legacy Fund: Humanitarian Foundation that holds funds, the interest of which provides the necessary budgeting needs for many of the humanitarian organizations within the parish, for example, Camp Transfiguration is an important recipient for needy children.

The Task Force for Jerusalem: Raises funds and awareness for Christians in the Middle East.

St. George Cancer Support Group: Give support and counseling to persons and their families who suffer from Cancer; an affiliate to the Royal Victoria Hospital.

The Cedars Cancer Group: The parent group to the St. George Cancer Group associated with St. George dealing within and outside of the St. George community.

The Ladies Aid: Associated to St. George and St. Nicholas Churches helping those in financial need within and outside of the church community.

St. George Men's Club/Young Women's Club: Both hold social events for the members of the community and also provide food for the less fortunate in the parish during Christmas and Easter.

The Antiochian Women: In addition to the mandate placed upon them from the Archdiocese, the Antiochian Women raise funds for scholarships for our camping program and also help families in financial need.

Gabriel Rossy Memorial Fund: This fund provides financial assistance to youth outreach programs in the Montreal region.

St. George Adoption: This committee in co-operation with the Archdiocese is dedicated to facilitate the adoption of children from Lebanon as in the past when twenty-five infants came to Canada through the Church.
